Summer Reading Successes Rewarded

At the end of the library's eight week Summer Reading Club *Reach for the Stars* program, the numbers were tallied and showed that 632 children at the Lowell library and its Shelby and Schneider branches were registered in the program. Having read 24,850 books and 34,477 chapters, over 2,042 rewards were given which included RailCats tickets, McDonald's McFlurries certificates, coupons for free French fries from Burger King, chicken dinners from KFC, kids' meals from Applebees, and Indiana Beach passes.

Of course, it wasn't all reading. The children had a lot of fun at the programs, including crafts and cooking. The mini-carnival and the reptile show were well attended.

Nature Club at the branches was also very popular. The Enviromobile, a night walk, and bug pinning were a few of the activities the children enjoyed.

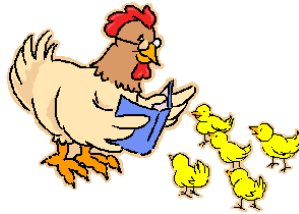
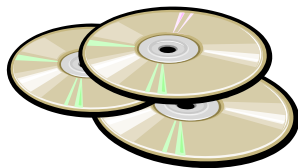
