Can you believe the last time we held our annual exhibit was in 2019? Friends of the Lowell Public Library are excited to be able to host the exhibit once again this year! You are invited to view the creativity and imaginations of elementary grade students from Oak Hill, Three Creeks, and Lake Prairie Schools, the week of May 9-13. The many works of art done in oils, watercolors, chalks, and computer graphics, as well as 3D works of art, will be on display throughout the library.

On Wednesday, May 11 at 6:00 PM, the Friends will hold a special reception for the young artists and their family members when they can enjoy cake and punch. Students will be recognized for their efforts with certificates of achievement. The certificates will be distributed by the school art teachers the following week.

All children (grades K-5) who attend can enter to win free art supplies. The drawing will take place on Thursday, May 12 and winners will be notified by phone. Can't make it to the reception? You are more than welcome to see your child's artwork at any time that week during regular library hours!

Self-Serve Pick-Up Lockers!

Pick Up Lockers will soon be available at all three of our locations. Pick up your items 24/7, when it is convenient for you, even when the library is closed!

How it Works:

Call us to request a locker pickup. Your items will be checked out to your account and placed into a locker (additional lockers will be used if you have too many items to fit into one locker). You have 3 days to pick up your items before they are checked in and returned to the library. All items are eligible for locker pick up, EXCEPT hotspots.

Come to the library lockers (next to book drop). Scan your library card and the locker (s) containing your items will open. Remove items and close locker. Please remember to close locker after removing your items.

Please continue to use the book drop to return you items. DO NOT return any items inside the lockers. If you need additional information - ask us!

We often take photographs at library events. These pictures are used for publicizing the library and its programs.

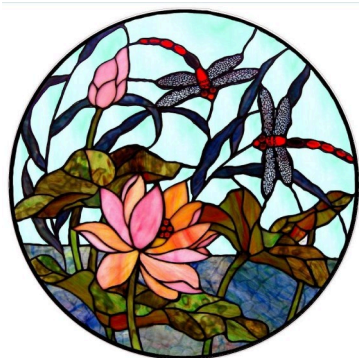

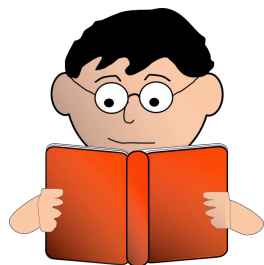
