#### **Ghostly Happenings!**

Do you hear moans and sighs in the middle of the night. Ever experience a tingling sensation on the back of your neck or see a shadow pass by when no one is there? Is your house haunted?



The Northwest Indiana Ghost Trackers will be at the library on Tuesday, October 26, at 7 PM to give you an insightful look into ghostly places in Indiana and tell of stories and myths of our area.

The Ghost Trackers is an organization that performs ghost "hunts" in Indiana and have conducted frequent investigations of sites that are reported to them as being haunted. A non-profit organization, the Ghost Trackers provide resources that may be of assistance to the public. Members help in cemetery and historic landmark repair.

Last year, the Ghost Trackers investigated the library after closing hours for the presence of ghosts using tape recorders, video and digital cameras, and equipment that detects temperatures and electrical impulses. The results of their investigation concluded that the library was haunted, but, only by visiting ghosts. Ghostly activity was high however, in the library woods. The Ghost Trackers will repeat their investigation before the program date and show you their results.

How do you get rid of a ghost? Why do some people feel the presence of a ghost and not others? Can you talk to a ghost? Bring your questions and if you have experienced a ghostly encounter, feel free to share your stories with others at the program.

If you are a doubter, remember! The Halloween season is the best time to suspend reality for a while and let your imagination take over for a little fun. By the way, all of the ghosts that visit the library are friendly! Just ask Casper!
