


Lowell Library Lines October 2006



Was the Creature in the Neighborhood?





What a find! Four, possibly five mastodon fossils were found on a farm in neighboring Hebron. One of those mastodon bones, a jaw bone or tusk will be on display for a special presentation by Chief Curator and Paleontologist Dr. Ron Richards of the Indiana State Museum on Thursday, October 25, at 6 PM. After the discovery in June of 2005. Dr. Richards led a team of archeologists, paleontologists and volunteers that extradited the mastodons, which probably met their end trapped in peat bogs that permeated the area. After their removal, the mastodon bones were subject to over 6 months of cleaning, testing (including DNA) and preservation. Eventually, the mastodons will be permanently displayed at the Indiana State Museum.

"Some of the most popular books in the library are on prehistoric animals, and mastodons are a particular favorite," stated Children's Programmer Mrs. Mayhew. "Dr. Richards visit provides a unique opportunity for our community residents, young and older, to learn more about these fascinating creatures and the results of the testing that was conducted on their bones.

Paint Halloween Cones on


Saturday, October 14, at 9 AM. Make a bat and a cat. Fee is \$13 due upon registration. All supplies are provided.
