Know What You're Voting For: How Tax Caps Will Affect You

On November 2 you will be asked to vote to permanently place tax caps into the state's constitution. While the word "caps" makes one think that property taxes won't increase, that is not the case at all. It is a cap on the taxes paid relative to the assessed value of the home. So, if your assessed value rises, so will your taxes. Placing tax caps into the constitution will result in unintended consequences such as user fees, fines, penalties, assessments, and possibly even more regulatory fees due to the lost property tax revenue. The caps have already resulted in losses of millions of dollars for schools, libraries, and other services.

While everyone wishes for lower taxes, few want the consequences. Schools, streets, libraries, emergency services and police protection all suffer. That is why it is so important for you to do your research and know what you are voting for on November 2. A free tax information packet is available at the circulation desk.
