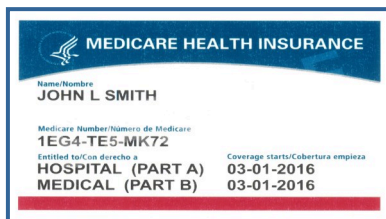

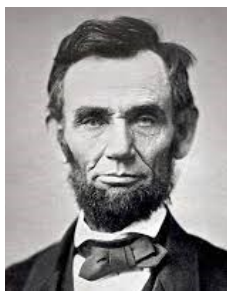

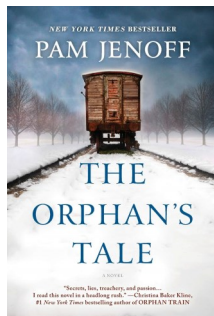

The Political Lincoln: Honest Abe on Campaigns and Elections

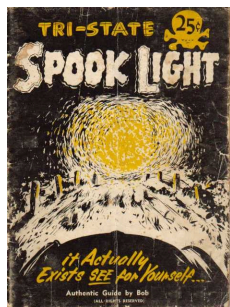

What We Are Doing to Keep You Safe

- Masks are required and all social distancing guidelines should be followed.
- “Stand Here” X’s have been placed throughout the library and plastic shields have been installed at our reference and circulation desks.
- Only 15 Patrons will be allowed in the library at one time and for no longer than 30 minutes. Tutoring/small group space is not available.
- Print/Copy/Scan/Fax services will be available, however due to social distancing guidelines, they are self-service only.
- Computer usage is limited to 1/2 hour and machines are sanitized between use. Staff cannot provide "over the shoulder" assistance as we will be maintaining recommended distancing. Please bring someone with you if you think you will need technical help.
- Curbside service is still available by request.
- No donations can be accepted at this time. Please do not leave donations outside our doors.
- All materials must be returned to the OUTSIDE book drop only. Items are quarantined before being put back into circulation.
- Because of limited staff, it is not possible to ensure that bathrooms and other common surface areas are sanitized at all times; please act accordingly.
- All programs for children, teens, and adults will continue to be enjoyed virtually. Subscribe to our YouTube channel. Crafts, cooking, history programs, and story time are among some of the topics you can explore and learn from!
- Study and meeting rooms and some furniture will not be available to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Remaining furniture has been rearranged to promote social distancing.

We appreciate the public’s patience during this time as we restore library service in varying stages. We look forward to welcoming the community back into our buildings and also to the day when we can restore full operations safely.
