A \$25,000 START FOR ENDOWMENT FUND!

Congratulations to the Lowell Public Library Endowment Board for the success of their first fundraiser. Over \$25,000 has been raised in cash and pledges since the fundraiser began in April. The Endowment Fund was founded to help meet the future needs of the Library

ENJOY THE COLORS OF AUTUMN

Mother Nature is about to provide a spectacular display of colors at the library as the autumn season begins. Over 300 trees on the 51/2 wooded site surrounding the facility will change to golds, browns and oranges, offering a showcase for library visitors to enjoy.

Among the trees displaying their colors are oaks, maples, Ohio buckeye, pagoda, dogwood, Carolina silverbell, black gum, hop Hornbeam, river birch, and apple serviceberry.

Four new Cedar benches, handcrafted by Lowell resident and master carpenter Allen Roberts, have been set around the library building for the comfort of visitors who wish to relax and view the woods beyond.

Chris Wilson, a Lowell High School Junior in his tenth year of scouting, has also constructed a bench to be placed on the library grounds. Chris is working toward earning his Eagle Scout Badge from the Boy Scouts of America, and his bench project is one of the ways he can accomplish his goal and provide a service for his community. SHELBY BRANCH UNDERGOES CONSTRUCTION

Anticipation! Building plans are being finalized for the new Shelby Branch Library and soon the sounds of hammer on nails will signal that the remodeling process for the 1200 sq. ft. library has begun. The branch library will be housed in a section of a building that also

contains the Shelby Post Office.

Walls will be removed to make room for two bathrooms (one will be handicapped accessible) and shelving will be added as well as new carpeting and more lighting.

The Project Team for the new Shelby Branch are Architect Phillip Bachman of the Bachman Partnership, Allen Roberts of Born to Build, Bill Carlson of Carlson Electric, and Jim Rust of Total Plumbing Services.

Funding for the project was made possible through Build Indiana Funds and a donation from Wilco Foods' through its Receipt Program. The Friends of the Library have also donated funds for the project.
