

Travel with renowned Ghost Hunter, Richard Crowe for the haunting adventure of a lifetime. Enter the realm of the unknown on Wednesday evening, November 4, at 7 PM for a journey filled with legend, lore, and the unexplained!! By comfort bus you will travel from the library to the Windy City, with Crowe as your guide. During the journey Crowe will spins tales of Chicago's disasters, tragedies and colorful characters. On this night he will provide a look into Chicago's past, its ghostly secrets unveiled. You'll roam historical and haunted locations, such as the site of the Eastland Disaster. You'll chill at the haunted site of the St. Valentine's Day Massacre. Into the Resurrection Triangle you will travel in pursuit of "Resurrection Mary," an experience at a cemetery you will long remember. You will hear the Chicago origin of the "Rosemary's Baby" tale and other stories told of Chicago's past glories as you search out the next ghostly locations with Crowe, dean of Chicago's haunts for 25 years. "A visual apparition is the rarest of psychic encounters. Listen, feel and smell, and you're more likely to experience something mysterious." states Crowe, who once saw a ghostly presence behind the Museum of Science and Industry, a place where the famous lawyer Clarence Darrow promised to return.

Dillinger, and Dion O'Banion, gangsters who have met untimely ends are part of the legends of Chicago and part of Crowe's storytelling adventures of the tour. Dillinger aficionados and Capone groupies will love Crowe's gangland tales.

On the tour you will stop at the site of the "Curse of the Chicago Cubs," the infamous Billy Goat Tavern. You can enjoy a respite for food and drink there. The tavern opened in 1934, near the Chicago Stadium, before moving to its present home 30 years later, under Michigan Avenue. The curse against the Chicago Cubs was placed on the ball team by Billy Goat's original owner, Billy Sianis. Billy and his pet goat were denied admission to a World Series game. He placed a curse on the Cubs and they lost the series and had a brutal loosing streak that lasted almost 50 years. We wonder what Billy would say about the Cubs now!

Fee for the "Haunting" is \$30 (non-refundable) due upon registration. Seating is limited so register now! Call your friends. Make it a party! Hop on board! The day after you return from your journey you may wish to check out the hauntings in the library, books that is! Or maybe you would rather visit at night! Happy hauntings!!!
