#### 2009 in a Nutshell

The big news of 2009 was the proposal to consolidate all Indiana Libraries into county-wide systems. Protests came in droves in opposition to the proposal. Our Tri-Creek community residents and



residents of other Indiana communities let their voices be heard downstate with phone calls, letters and E-mails.

A bill to consolidate (HB 348) was introduced and passed in the State House. The bill became integrated with other bills under SB 252 and did not make it out of committee. Although there is a chance that a consolidation bill may be introduced in the Indiana Legislature in 2010, it is not likely to pass.

#### Other Good News in 2009

In related news, Tri-Creek residents who have a library card from their home library can now visit any Lake County Public Library to check out books and magazines. Check to make sure your home library card is still valid.

#### AND...

In 2009 the library began offering fax service at the Reference Desk. Faxes are \$1 per page for faxes sent within the United States. To send an international fax the fee is \$10 for the first page and \$5 for each additional page. A public access scanner is now available in the Redbud computer room. The printer in the computer room prints black and white copies.

The library is now offering downloadable eAudiobooks. Through our subscription to NetLibrary and Recorded books, patrons can now choose from 1,800 eAudiobook titles to download and listen to CD Quality audiobooks on their home computers or from their favorite portable players (half of the selection is iPod compatible). The library also began circulating pre-loaded, portable, digital audio books that can be used with earbuds for hands-free listening. A revolving collection, every 90 days half of the collection is returned to the supplier and ten new selections will be delivered to the library. The selections are located at a table display fronting the circulation desk.
