Celebrating Indiana Authors

In observance of National Authors' Day, November 1, the Lowell Public Library will have a special display of books written by Indiana authors, in the main room of the library from November 1 to November 3.

The display will move to the library Program Room on Saturday, November 4, where the GFWC Lowell Woman's Club will join the library in recognizing Indiana authors with a special celebration including music provided by the Lowell Senior High School and refreshments served by the Woman's Club. The public is invited to attend from 2 PM to 4 PM.

While co-sponsoring the Authors' Day celebration, the Lowell Woman's Club is also observing their 90th anniversary as a service organization.

Observance of National Authors' Day was adopted by the General Federation of Woman's Clubs in 1929, and in 1949, by resolution, the day was placed on a list by the US Department of Commerce.

Flu Immunizations

Immunizations will be conducted by Clinical Management Services on a first come/first served basis. The cost of the flu vaccine is \$25. Children's Book Week: November 13-19, 2006

During National Children's Book Week, a display of posters celebrating reading will be on display in the Children's Room. Created by members of the Spurs & Saddles 4 H Club as a Lake County Fair project, the display represents the diversity of reading choices made by the young readers and is meant to promote reading in young people.

A special *Bingo for Books* program for pre-school to 5th grade children will be held on Thursday, November 16. Pre-register for the 10 AM or 3 PM session. Take home a new or gently used book and a bookmark.

The Elephant Graveyard

For those of you who missed the program on the Mastodons of Hebron here are some of the interesting facts on last year's "gigantic" discovery of the bones of mastodons found on a farm in neighboring Hebron. A team of 15 scientist and volunteers led by Ron Richards, head curator of the Indiana State Museum, unearthed the bones at the site.

The group found the 12000 year old bones of 7 mammals, representing the largest mastodon find in Indiana and one of the largest in the country. All were females. No DNA could be extracted because of the effects of freezing/ thawing conditions, drainage, and bacteria that deteriorate bones over time. The best finds were 13 tusks, 5 jaws and a well preserved skull. The site of the find had once been a conifer forest as determined by the pinecones the scientist found. Most likely the mastodons fell through the ice of a natural watering hole and met their end, before their time. Also found were the bones of stag moose, giant beaver, small fish, frogs, snakes, voles, and muskrat, all associated with the time period of the mastodon.
