

The Great Circus Train Wreck of 1918

Tragedy On The Indiana Lakeshore Monday, November 17 at 6 PM

In the early hours of June 22, 1918, a train engineer drifted to sleep traveling toward Hammond, Indiana. Soon after, the sleeping engineer's locomotive plowed into the idle twenty-six car Hagenbeck-Wallace Circus Train.

More than two hundred circus performers were injured and eighty -six were killed, most of whom were buried in a mass grave in the Showmen's Rest section

of Chicago's Woodlawn C e m e t e r y . Contrary to various stories recounting the events of the train wreck, not one circus animal was injured.
