We are thankful for The Friends of the Library

The Friends, founded by Alice Van Nada in 1974, have raised thousands of dollars – over \$30,000 in the last five years alone – to help fund children's, adult, young adult and senior programming at the library; and provide monies for needed items.

Highlights from the Friends' "history book" is the 10 years – from 1975 to 1985 – that the Friends hosted the Arts and Crafts Fair. The event became "Art Among the Evergreens" when the Friends moved it to Evergreen Park, where nearly 100 artists from the Midwest and around the country exhibited their fine art and craftsmanship each July.

Beginning in 1987 and for the following 24 years W. Brian Mathias "arranged" Santa's visit to the Lowell Public Library for Santa's Story Time and broadened his visits to include Shelby and Schneider branch libraries.

Through petition drives, letter-writing campaigns and other means, the Friends lent their support for the construction of the present library, dedicated in 1993.

An important highlight in the Friends history is their 2 year lobbying efforts and petition drive efforts to support the library in its fight to remain an independent library district, following Indiana's 2007 Kernan-Shepard Report recommending that all Indiana libraries consolidate into 92 library systems. The bill, introduced in the Indiana Legislature, was defeated in a Senate committee.

Twice a year Friends hold a Scholastic Book Sale. Proceeds from the sale have enabled the library to add to its book collection and to purchase prizes for the Summer Reading Club. The Friends are also recognized for their contribution to the Children's Room mural. The mural was created by nationally recognized artist Dennis Orlowski. The Friends celebrated their 40th anniversary in 2014 by reviving their annual rummage sale. For over 35 years the Friends have sponsored the Children's Student Art Exhibit held each May in the library.

The Friends also raise money for the library by holding a \$2 bag book sale the last Saturday each month in addition to special book sale events throughout the year.

The Friends will be holding a meeting/pot luck/tree trimming party on Friday, November 30 at 5 PM. Come and meet the Friends and bring a dish to share. Call the library to let Bethany know if you plan to attend.

What is hoopla? Hoopla is digital media service that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone — even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later. There are hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from with more being added daily. hoopla is like having your public library at your fingertips -- anytime, anywhere.

How do I borrow and play titles? Download the app from either the Apple Store or Google Play. Before you are able to borrow, you will need to create a hoopla account. Setting up your account is easy! Enter your library card number and the pin number associated with your library card, then provide your email address and a log-in password.

Once you are signed in, you can borrow titles through your hoopla digital mobile app or the hoopla link on our website. Once you select a title, click on the "borrow" button on the title details page. Once a title is borrowed, it is accessible by clicking on "My hoopla" in your app. You can borrow up to 4 titles per month!

No library card? Getting a library card is easy too. Just bring in proof of residency (with your current address) and a photo ID.
