

Nestled on a five and one half acre wooded site, the new building is intended to be a community gathering place, transcending the traditional concept of a library.

Many surprises await visitors as they enter the main entrance at the north end of the building. 
A series of his photographs taken in Southern Indiana are part of the permanent collection of the University of Southern Indiana.

VALLEY VOICES

John Ghrist, author of "Valley Voices" is a veteran of over 25 years of broadcasting. For several of those years he was at WLCL, serving Lowell, Cedar Lake and South Lake County. John is coming back to Lowell to take part in the celebration of the new library.

"Valley Voices," a history of radio in Indiana and Illinois will be presented by John on Wednesday, November 10, at 7:00 PM in the library's Program Room. John will tell of an era of radio that had the entire family, grandparents, parents and children spellbound.

Participants will enjoy taking a trip down memory lane, guessing the names of radio shows of the 30's and 40's that are included in John's slide presentation.

CATERPILLAR, WRITTEN BY PEGGY GENGE

She is known throughout the Tri-Creek area as "Aunt Peggy". Over a twenty-five year span Peggy Genge, author of <u>Caterpillar</u> had "graduated" hundreds of boys and girls from her nursery school and in that time she developed methods of teaching and writing stories for her classes. One of those stories was "Caterpillar", a charming tale of the workings of nature.

On Saturday, November 13, at 10:00 A.M., "Aunt Peggy" will share her book <u>Caterpillar</u> and other stories with area children, ages 3 to 5 years, attending a special Story Time in the new library Program Room.
