SUPERHIGHWAY ACCESS IN '97

Accessing the Internet using Lowell Public Library computers will become a reality for patrons in 1997. That was the goal of Interim Director Phyllis Nelson and Reference Librarian Darlene Rigg when they applied for an Indiana Technology Grant in July of this year.

On October 22 Governor Evan Bayh made the announcement that \$2 million in grants would be awarded to Indiana libraries. The Lowell Public Library was one of the recipients.

The grant allows for 5 new computers and a 56K line that will provide the library with direct connections or dial up access to the Internet. The public will then be able to access information world wide using any one of the new computers. Implementation of the technology is expected to be completed by late spring.

SCHNEIDER "OPEN HOUSE"

Tri-Creek community residents are invited to the Schneider Branch Library "Open House" on Sunday, November 3, from 2 PM to 4 PM. Enjoy a cup of coffee or punch and delicious cookies prepared by library staff and volunteers and visit with Branch Head Betty Beier.

The branch library is housed in the Schneider Community Building, and holds 4,439 items to-date, including books, magazines, pamphlets, cassettes, books-on-tape, compact discs, videos and literacy materials. Over 180 patrons are registered at this location.

The latest remodeling project for the branch library began in 1995 when a wall was knocked out to increase the size of the library. New carpeting was installed and the walls were painted in September of this year.

Funding for the project was made possible in part through a donation from the Friends of the Library through the Wilco Receipt Program.
