Dues for the Friends are \$5 yearly. There is a new lifetime membership available for \$50. Call Nell Fabish at 696-7704 for more information.


Library Receives Visitor From North Pole

On Line With the Library

Patrons of the Lowell Public Library and its branches who have Internet service in their homes or workplaces can renew their materials on line and place holds on books and other library materials by accessing http://javapac.lakeco.lib.in.us/webclient.html.

The Lowell Library is an independent district serving West Creek, Cedar Creek and Eagle Creek Townships, with branch libraries in Shelby and Schneider. The Lowell system has a contractual agreement with the Lake County system that allows Lowell patrons to order materials through the public access catalog that includes holdings from both library systems.

Patrons wishing to use on-line renewal are asked to please visit the circulation desk to provide the library with a 4 digit PIN (personal identification number) that allows the user to access the service. An information sheet giving step by step instructions for renewing or ordering materials will be available at the desk.

If the Lowell Library owns a copy of the item you are requesting, please select that copy whenever possible. This will keep the cost of the service down since the library pays a per item charge for materials ordered from the Lake County Library.
