Dec. 19th, Thursday School age - 4:00 PM


Pre-schoolers will make a jolly Santa ornament. School age will make a holly leaf wreath.

CHRISTMAS CLOSING

The Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider Branches will be closed Tuesday, December 24th and Wednesday, December 25th in observance of the Christmas holiday.

Regular library hours will resume on Thursday, Dec. 26th at 9:00 AM at the Lowell Public Library and at 4:00 PM in the Shelby Branch Library. At the Schneider Branch Library, the doors will open at 3:00 PM.

SPOTTED TREES

If you think you're seeing spots on trees when you pass the site for the new library, your eyes are not deceiving you. You're really seeing orange and blue paint on the tree trunks.

The Hardesty Surveying Company of Dyer was asked to mark each tree which was six inches or larger in diameter. Harold Bruner, consulting forester from Walton, Indiana, then painted a blue spot on each tree which should be harvested... either because it is mature, or because it is located where the new library will be built.

The library's architect, David Nice, of Pecsok, Jelliffe, Randall & Nice, worked with Bruner to situate the new building where the fewest trees would be affected.

Of the hundreds of trees on the site, only fifty-two will have to be removed.

The "design phase" of the building is now virtually complete, and the architects are beginning "construction documents" prior to advertising for bids in the spring of 1992.
