The Lowell Public Library is expanding its services in the area by providing materials and staff to operate the library in the Community Center in Schneider. The library there has been operated for several years by volunteers.

Federal funds for this project have been provided through the Library Services and Construction Act.

The exact date has not been confirmed, but the opening will take place soon. Patrons may borrow books, magazines and pamphlets, records and audio cassettes. Other items or titles will be sent from the Lowell Library through inter-library loan.

Plans are also underway for opening a branch library in Shelby. Hours for the branches will be Monday through Thursday, 4 P.M. - 7 P.M. and Saturdays, 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M.
