### TREE OF RED, WHITE AND BLUE SALUTES OUR SOLDIERS IN THE PERSIAN GULF

The staff and Friends of the Lowell Public Library dedicated a very special Christmas tree to the men and women of the armed forces who are serving overseas in the Persian Gulf.

The Christmas tree, donated by the Lowell Lions Club, stands as a symbol of the concern and support area residents have shown to these service personnel thru letters and packages of needed items sent to the gulf.

Small, brightly wrapped packages of red, white and blue adorn the tree, while stars with American flags bears the names of service men and women, relatives of area residents.

With the ending of the Christmas season, the names of service personnel on the tree will be transferred to a special area in the library foyer to serve as a show of support to our troops overseas.
