## **Lowell Lions Aid Visually Impaired**

Going on the hunt to find the perfect tree to decorate for the Christmas season is an age old tradition. This year, the trees bought by community residents at a Lowell Lions Club fundraiser not only graced the living rooms of many area homes but provided a means for the Lowell Lions to help the visually impaired.

All of the proceeds from the Lions tree sale, \$3000, was allocated to the Lowell Library for the purchase of a video magnifier. With its 20" (TV screen) unit, visually impaired users can enjoy reading books, magazines, photographs, newspapers, prescription labels, legal papers, etc., in color or black and white, and magnified more than 100%. The magnifier will be available for use the second week of February. Staff will be happy to demonstrate the magnifier.

Last year the Lions Club donated \$2800 from their Lowell Labor Day "Pitch In" fundraiser to the Lowell Fire Department for a "heat seeking" camera. The Lions also provide free eyeglasses to needy children through the school system. The Lions Club has a membership of 50 hard working volunteers. To join the Lions Club call Leon Morrow at 696-7344. Acoustic guitarist Josh Holmes and his band and harmonica musician Brett Sayers entertained the crowd of standing room only patrons. Gourmet coffee and pastries were available. Another popular and successful fundraiser was the annual bus trip to the Flower and Garden Show in Chicago. Friends are offering the trip again this year on Sunday, March 12. Tickets for the bus are \$15 with admission to the show to be paid at the door. Friends also voted to purchase two book carts for the library in March and two magazine racks for the Schneider Branch Library.

At the close of the Wilco Foods Receipt Program Friends expressed their gratitude to Wilco Foods for over \$9000 in donations they had received from the program over the years. The Student Art Exhibit and Reception the Friends sponsored in May gave many young students of the Tri-Creek area an opportunity to showcase their work to community residents. "I Love the Library" T-shirts and plastic book bags with rope handles were purchased in May for an on-going sale at the circulation desk.

The library was made even more beautiful with their decorating efforts for the holidays. What a fun evening it was!

Santa Claus delighted the children at Lowell and its branches with his story-telling, sing-a-long-with - Santa performance and his special personal visit with each child that attended his Santa Claus Story Time. What a Santa (AKA Brian Mathias)! From the Children's Holiday Book Sale at the library, Friends purchased over \$400 in books for the library's collection and prizes for the 2000 Summer Reading Club Program.

"All in all, 1999 was a great year of accomplishment for the Friends," stated Friends President Tom Spencer. "I want to thank all who participated in these efforts to support the library, and I hope that the year 2000 will see even more community residents join us in helping the Lowell Public Library be the best library it can be."
