The die cuts are used to create displays for the library.

Friends generate monies to donate to the library through their on-going booksale located in the non-fiction section of the library and from proceeds generated from the public copier. In December the Friends raised more funds with their holiday wreath sale. Friends bookbags, coloring books and Nature Trail T-shirts. The organization also plans a rummage/bake sale in June.


Monday Morning Movie
