

Lowell Library Lines February 2008



Newspaper and Yearbook Indexes on Lowell History Website

For several years volunteers and library staff have been indexing Lowell newspapers for personal names from important family events like marriages, births, deaths, etc., making local research a bit more convenient for people working on family histories. Only those issues of newspapers that are in the Lowell Public Library holdings can be indexed, and some issues of past years are missing. This is especially true of the older newspapers.

Recently a browsable index of this data has been put online at our Lowell History website, http://www.lowell.pl.lib.in.us/history.htm. Thus far newspaper indexes are available for the years 1872 (Lowell Star), 1901-1903 (Lowell Souvenir), and 1916-1917, 1920-1929, and 1944-2007 (Lowell Tribune). As more newspapers are indexed, this data will be added to the site.

Since the library owns all the papers that are indexed, either on microfilm or in hard copy, family researchers will be able to find and photocopy whichever full text articles appeared on their families for the indexed years. If you need assistance, ask for help at the Reference Desk.

Reference Librarian Darlene Rigg recently indexed the Lowell High School yearbooks, and this information can be accessed at the same Lowell History site. Yearbooks were not published for the years 1931-1934 because of the Great Depression, and the library does not have copies for the years 1918-1920, 1980-1981 and 1985-1987. Other than those years, all yearbooks have been indexed for both names and photos between the years 1915-2005. Library visitors may use the index for easy access in finding friends and loved ones in the yearbooks.

If anyone would like to donate a copy of the yearbooks not in the library's collection, it would be greatly appreciated.

Marriages, Births, and Deaths Online

Genealogy enthusiast Joan Kessel, volunteer at the Lowell Public Library for over a year, has been pouring over microfilm issues of the town's weekly paper from the 1920's and has created a database of engagements, marriages, births, deaths, etc. This extremely labor-intensive job can only be done by someone with an eye for details and a love for the work since microfilmed papers from that far back are hard on the eyes and the print is sometimes difficult to decipher. In addition, quite often a marriage, death, birth or other event was given only a single line in the newspaper, often with no headline, making it necessary for Joan to read every line in every column of each issue of the paper.

In addition to her volunteer work on the library's newspaper database, Joan has been a volunteer with other genealogy projects in Lake County and was named Volunteer of the Year by the Northwest Indiana Genealogical Society. Joan is currently working on her certification as a genealogist.

Joan is now working on a similar index for the 1930's papers. The 1920's Lowell Tribune index to family events is available to the public online at our website, http://www.lowellpl.lib.in.us/history.htm
