# SAT Test Preparation Classes

Take the first step to learn more about SAT prep! Need to sharpen your skills? What about test taking strategies? Want to learn how to do your best on the timed test? High school students can learn what they need to know to take the SAT test now!

Six classes of two hours each will begin at 10 AM., Saturday, February 12, 2011. Classes will meet on February 12, 19, 26 and March 5, 12, and 19 and be taught by Mrs. Gloria Vela, a licensed English & Reading teacher. She will instruct college-bound students in how to score high on the Writing, Critical Reading and Math sections of the timed SAT test offered at area high schools in May and June, 2011.

A fee of \$160.00 is due at the first class. (Make checks payable to Gloria Vela). A 2011 Kaplan SAT book will be yours to keep.
