The Indiana Talking Book and Braille Library (TBBL), a division of the Indiana State Library, circulates via mail audio books and magazines, Braille books, large print books, and descriptive videos to Indiana residents who cannot use standard print materials because of a visual or physical disability. There are also over twenty-two thousand digital books and forty digital magazines available for download.

A free, simple to use, digital player is also provided to the patrons for listening to audio materials. To qualify for this free library service the applicant fills out an application (available at the reference desk) and has it signed by a healthcare professional or librarian.
