Local Author and Psychologist Publishes First Mystery

Dr. Belinda Hubert is an author of fiction and poetry and a clinical psychologist maintaining a private practice, *Primary Care Center for Psychological Health*, in Lowell, Indiana. In addition to her debut novel, *Shrink Wrapped*, available on Amazon.com and Kindle, she has several poems and flash fiction pieces published in Indiana Voice Journal and she writes a blog titled http://buelasprairiepractice.blogspot.com. She is currently working on several new projects, including finishing up a second mystery in the Dr. Dryden series titled *Crackers*, a rainbow series of children's books, a compilation of her poetry and short stories about life in the Midwest, and a travel book about Samoens, France.

Shrink Wrapped is romantic thriller is a story of a psychologist caught up in a high-stakes search for a missing child.

"I wanted to base my story in the Midwest because I love it here, and this is an area under represented in the media. I went to school on the East coast, lived in the South and I've vacationed all over the US, some of Europe and South America. Every time I vacation somewhere, I think I would love living there; and I probably would. And I choose to live here." Midwesterners will recognize themselves in many of the *Shrink Wrapped* characters."

Dr. Hubert has already donated a copy of her book to our library. She will be available to talk about *Shrink Wrapped* and autograph copies on Wednesday, February 10 at 6 PM. Pre-register.

Did you know that you can download free eBooks and Audiobooks from the library's website? After logging in with your library card and pin number, you can browse the collection and download to PC, Mac, and many mobile devices.

This service, powered by OverDrive, is provided free by the library to patrons in the Lowell Public Library district.

To get started, you will need to install free software. For audiobooks, OverDrive® Media Console™; to read eBooks, you'll need Adobe® Digital Editions. To transfer books to other devices you need to register for an Adobe ID. Downloaded books can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including NOOK, Sony Reader, iPod, and many others!



Wowbrary is a free service that informs you by weekly e-mails about recently published books, DVDs, and CDs that we have added to our collection.

It makes it easy for you to browse through the latest additions and place a hold on a new title To sign up for weekly updates, Log on to www.wowbrary.org and hit the "Sign Up" tab.

Enter your zip code, choose "Lowell Public Library," enter your e-mail address, and Submit. After clicking the Submit button you will receive an e-mail with a link you must activate. Your e-mail alerts will begin arriving on the next week.
