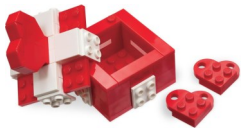
Pajama Story Time

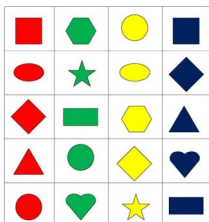
Lego Club
