LITERACY PROGRAM TAKES A LOOK BACK

Having completed its seventh year of operation, the library's Adult Literacy Program is serving an increasingly larger number of students. The program's twenty trained volunteers and their students had an out-standing year, logging over 1300 hours of tutoring time including numerous hours in computer instruction.

For the second straight year, tutors extended their efforts to outreach locations in local grade schools where they worked to assist teachers and students to overcome language barriers.

Additional outreach projects included family literacy classes on parenting for Head Start families. The literacy program donated a small library collection to Head Start to encourage a love of reading in children.

The literacy program purchased 70 additional items for the library's literacy collection, including new easy reading and independent study materials, and additional software. The purchase of two laptop computers will be used to introduce students to basic word processing skills.

The program also reached out to many more English-As-A-Second Language students in '94, serving both year-round and seasonal workers. The program not only offers literacy tutoring to adult ESL students but extends help to their children as well. This trend in literacy programs is occurring nation-wide as more and more immigrants come to the United States seeking job opportunities.

For a literacy program to experience real success, it must help students and tutors to achieve their goals. Because of a deeply caring group of tutors and very dedicated, determined students, success became a reality in '94.


