

Happy Birthday Dr. Seuss

Come to the birthday party for Dr. Seuss at the Lowell Public Library on Saturday, March 1, at 1 PM and have a piece of Dr. Seuss' birthday cake after you listen to really funny stories, read by very special people, wearing very funny, very tall, red and white Seuss hats!

State Representative Robert Kuzman will be a Seuss reader at the party. He will come with his wife Cheryl...and young son Evan who loves Dr. Suess books, especially *One Fish, Two Fish.* Joan Cole, Chairperson, ISTA-R, Nancy Nethery of Lowell Centier Bank, Lowell Police Department Officer John Swisher and a member of the Lowell Fire Department will also take turns reading Seuss books to children attending the party. Share the laughter with "Chickadee" the clown as she creates funny balloon animals that will be made for children to take home, too! And there will be other surprises at the party. Dr. Seuss (Theodore Geisel) began writing children's books in 1940 after reading an article by author John Hersey who thought that the books schools used to teach children to read were boring. With *Cat in the Hat*, Seuss created his first book with zany characters and rhyming. Today it would be hard to find a library without a collection of Dr. Seuss books. Children love the rhyming words in the books, and there is no doubt that listening to a Dr. Seuss book will put a smile on an adult face too.
