Every Child Ready to Read @ Your Library

The Children's Department has been expanding its programming to incorporate the new initiative sponsored by the Indiana State Library entitled *Every Child Ready to Read* @ *Your Library*. The main objective is to help in the development of early literacy skills in children 0-5 years old. One of the best ways to do this is to provide parents of young children with simple and fun tools they can use to develop pre-reading skills.

The library has been successful in promoting the program through a series of positive events, providing parents with literature about the early literacy initiative, including tips on what they can do to help their child get ready to read. Children who attend Toddler Time and Story Time not only experience activities that promote early literacy skills but also take home activities that can be done with their parents to reinforce the concepts.

In addition, Children's Programmer Mrs. Mayhew, has begun doing community outreach activities such as pre-school presentations, attending food pantry giveaways, bookwalks and bingo for books. Thanks to the generosity of our patrons Mrs. Mayhew has been able to distribute thousands of books to children who might not otherwise own their own books. The outreach programs have also seen several hundred children receive bears that they can read to!

The Friends of the Library helped further this initiative by purchasing three magazine subscriptions for our very young patrons and their parents. The new magazines will be highlighted in the children's programs and will be an additional tool for parents to help their children get ready to read.
