## Recapping 2009

Just how busy were we last year? Every year libraries across Indiana submit their annual reports to the Indiana State Library. Sifting through the many pages of statistics in the report can be a bit of a bore.
Cutting to the chase, the following are some of the more interesting statistics about your library, contained in the report.

Serving the Tri-Creek area, the library has 16,836 registered borrowers.
Programs held at the Central Library (Lowell) and its Shelby and Schneider Branches.

Adult Programs: 397 in house and 62 outreach.
Children's Programs held: 527 in house and 82 outreach.
Young Adult Programs held: 163.
Other special or outreach programs numbered 48.
In total the library offered its patrons 1,279 programs in 2009.
Attendance at these programs totaled 52,538.
Reference questions answered numbered $\mathbf{9 , 6 7 5}$.
The meeting rooms were used 8,938 times last year for non/library meetings/programs/events by local community organizations.

The total number of visitors to the library in 2009 numbered 109,317.
Users of the library's public access computers exceeded 22,200.
Over 240,210 hits were recorded on the library's web pages.
The library holdings include 81,919 books, 4,862 video materials, 3,855 audio materials, 2,357 electronic books (E-books) and 200 serial subscriptions.
There are always new and exciting things happening at the library.

Daylight Saving Time has been in use throughout much of the United States, Canada and Europe since World War I. In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson signed an act into law whereby Daylight Saving Time began on the last Sunday of April and ended on the last Sunday of October each year. In 2005, President Bush signed into law a new energy policy bill that would extend Daylight Saving Time by four weeks beginning in 2007. Daylight Saving Time begins at 2 AM on March 14, 2010. Don't forget to change your clocks!
