Antique Appraisals Saturday, March 8 11 AM - 1 PM

Karl Gates, a licensed appraiser with over 30 years experience including work as an appraiser for the United States Treasury Department, will begin with a presentation about antiques and collectables, sharing interesting facts and stories, and then will move on to item appraisals. Items brought in will be placed on tables at the front of the room. Each item will be presented to the audience along with background information.

Mr. Gates will appraise up to sixty items. Tickets for appraisals are now available at the circulation desk, \$5.00 each, limit ONE appraisal per person. No written appraisals will be given. (No weapons, coins or stamps.)

Deadline for registration is March 1 or when the 60th ticket is sold. (Because of the time factor that day, only sixty items can be appraised. Only 60 tickets will be sold.) 
Craft Corner

Thousands of artists, tens of thousands of albums, and hundreds of thousands of songs are available to registered cardholders of the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider branches.

Through Freegal, a downloadable music service, the library can patrons access to the Sony Music Entertainment Catalog, that offers over one hundred genres of music without having to download special software or dealing with any digital rights management (DRM) issues. The content is based upon a license with Sony Music Entertainment, owner of fifty-four different music labels.

To access Freegal, pick up an application form at the library and turn it in at the circulation desk or download one from the library's website. Look for the Freegal link on the left side of the page. An email message will be sent your address within 24 hours of being registered.
