Oh Oprah!

Is America reading? Just ask Oprah Winfrey and the American Library Association. Or just ask us! Oprah's "Book Club" is a hit with libraries across the nation and patrons at the library are lining up to reserve her latest book pick.

Here's how it works. Each month Oprah chooses a book (novels only) as the topic for one of her daily talk shows. The book selected is among the books that Oprah has read and wants to share with her audience and viewing public.

Enter the ALA (American Library Association) and book publishers. They work with Oprah's staff on the "Book Club." The ALA places Oprah's selection on a Web site letting librarians know the "Book CLub" selection. At Oprah's request the publisher of each "Book Club" selection donates 10,000 books to schools and libraries from a list provided by the ALA.

The World At Your Fingertips

Resting on an elegant wood stand with brass claw feet and antique brass-plated meridian is the library's latest and most stunning addition to the reference section.

The new Rand McNally 16" raised relief world globe (located on the east side of the reference desk) is rich in color and enhanced with ornate details. The globe provides a wonderful reference tool for researchers.

"Only a globe can give a correct picture of the earth as a whole. Because the surface of a globe is rounded like the earth's surface, a globe represents all parts of the earth's surface true to scale. Distances, areas, and directions can be observed without the distortion caused by projections used for flat maps. The shortest distance between two points on the earth or globe is defined by what is called a great circle. Navigators make use of a great-circle route in planning ship and air lanes. A great circle can be measured directly on a globe."

The river produces some of the biggest walleyes and northern pike in Indiana, some trophy size, especially in the spring. Fishing expert Din Beckrich will teach the basic strategy for successful fishing on the Kankakee River, covering such topics as river currents, river structure, basic baits, tackles and lures to use, and recognizing the best fishing spots.
