Every January the editors of <u>Library Journal</u> pick those books they believe to be the best of the previous year. Here are a few of the "Best of 1997" that are owned by the library.

Fiction:

American Pastoral by Philip Roth. Roth looks back at an innocent time when golden boy Seymour Levov, the pride of his neighborhood, was devastated by a child's violent act.

The God of Small Things by Arundhati Roy. The story of Indian twins Rahel and Estha is told in a witty, at times even caustic, voice.

Underworld by Don DeLillo. A dazzling and darkly funny novel that follows a myriad of characters across the Cold War decades to the fall of the Soviet regime.

Mystery:

A Certain Justice by P.D. James. What is justice? This question is examined in a brilliantly plotted novel.

SciFi:

Driving Blind by Ray Bradbury. The master of SF brings us a new collection of 21 short stories.

Award Winners

The most prestigious awards in children's literature have been announced by the American Library Association and are on order at the library.

The 1998 Newbery Award for writing goes to *Out of the Dust* by Karen Hesse (Scholastic Press). It tells the story of the recovery of a 14-year-old girl who is scarred in a fire that also kills her mother.

Rapunzel, the winner of the Caldecott Award is complex love story that can be appreciated on many levels by all ages. The book, illustrated by Paul O. Zelinsky, has classically beautiful illustrations with richly detailed oil paintings that convey dramatic emotions.


