# National Library Week April 15 - 21

In celebration of National Library Week the library will open its doors on Sunday, April 22, from 3 PM to 6 PM to welcome beginning and experienced poets, students and poetry lovers, to the NWI Poetry Society's "Poetry Slam." The Slam event offers anyone who would like to compete in the judged event an opportunity to express their creativity through the art of competitive poetry in a Coffee House atmosphere, before an audience.

Judges for the event include Indiana State Poet Laureate Joyce Brinkman, the first official Indiana poet laureate to be appointed by the Senate. She is a former State Representative, as well as a life-long poetry writer who has studied poetry at the University of New Orleans in Spain. Jeff Manes, columnist for the Lowell Tribune and the Post Tribune and theatrical performer in community theaters and Cornelius House, Indiana University Northwest, adjunct lecturer in literature and visiting instructor of German at Purdue University Calumet will also judge at the event.

Performing his original songs at the event is author and song writer Fred Anderson.


