Some will say it's a simple nursery rhyme taught to young children, but it's origin can be traced to a collection of writings by Thomas Tusser in the mid 1500's titled *A Hundred Good Points of Husbandry*. In the April section he wrote:

Sweet April showers Do spring May flowers

To adults, this simple poem or nursery rhyme is a reminder that even the most unpleasant of things, in this case the heavy rains of April, can bring about very enjoyable things, even an abundance of flowers in May.
