Quilt Lectures

Carole Sutton, quilt artist, author and teacher, returns for her last two presentations, Sensational Scraps and This is My Story: 50 years Since Being Introduced to Quilts.

Join us Thursday, April 10 at 6 PM for *Sensational Scraps*. Carole will show us some of the many stunning quilts she has made by challenging herself to use fabric from her stash. Four of the quilts have just short of eight hundred different fabrics in them, and each quilt has a story to tell.

On Wednesday, May 7, at 6 PM, Carole tells her own quilting story. She was introduced to quilting in 1964 when her mother-in-law took her up the winding stairway of the 1870's family farm home to show her a Civil War era log cabin quilt.

Since then, Carole has lectured extensively and taught classes. Her quilts have hung at national and regional shows.

We invite you to come see some of Carole's quilts and hear her fascinating quilting story.


Craft Corner

Thousands of artists, tens of thousands of albums, and hundreds of thousands of songs are available to registered cardholders of the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider branches.

Through *Freegal*, a downloadable music service, the library can patrons access to the Sony Music Entertainment Catalog, that offers over one hundred genres of music without having to download special software or dealing with any digital rights management (DRM) issues. The content is based upon a license with Sony Music Entertainment, owner of fifty-four different music labels.

To access *Freegal*, pick up an application form at the library and turn it in at the circulation desk or download one from the library's website. Look for the *Freegal* link on the left side of the page. An email message will be sent your address within 24 hours of being registered.
