


NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK


It's never to early to think about your career future so that you will be happy in the occupation you choose.

Now you see it, now you don't! Lots of activity will be going on at the library over the next few months as we make ready for the new Public Access Terminals that will arrive in late spring. The library is trying to maintain an efficient level of service to our patrons in quarters that seem to become more crowded daily.

The computer terminals will be placed near what is now the reading lounge area of the library and will allow patrons to search the library's collection and order books that are currently checked out from the library or from the Lake County Public Library. A reference desk, CD-ROM computer, Newsbank and other reference sources will be moved to this area.

New shelving located in the public area will house back issues (an average of 5yrs. depending on the publication) of magazines making them more accessible to patrons for checkout.

This move will free up desperately needed storage space for supplies used by the staff for administrative purposes such as processing of books and materials, programs, services and record keeping.

A computerized bookkeeping system will be installed in the staff workroom and new workspaces will be set up adjacent to the directors office. Maria Svorenick, cataloger, has already been relocated to the library's Indiana section. A study carrel has also been located in that area to accomodate patrons who prefer a quiet area to work in.

Spring cleaning means spring painting for the library's community room, hallways, kitchen and workroom.

The bright ivory color seems to make the rooms appear larger.

We hope library patrons will be pleased with the new look.

The library, aware of its role as a vital information center for the community, looks forward to other changes to come that will provide greater service for its patrons.
