WHY WE LOVE OUR FRIENDS

In truth, a wonderful group of "Friends of the Library" lease the copier to provide it to the library for patron use. "Friends" is an organization of area residents who dedicate their time and talents to benefit their community through their support of library programs and services.

Over the years Friends have donated funds to help the library with special purchases. They have organized library events; and improved library funding in the state legislation.

Each year for several years, Friends have donated over 200 paperback books to the library for the children's collection, purchased through the proceeds of the annual "Paperback Booksale." When the Shelby and Schneider Branch Libraries were formed, the Friends provided books for their children's collection as well.

April is a time when libraries all across the nation celebrate National Library Week. During that special week, Friends assist the library in serving refreshments to library visitors.

Friends were able to allocate \$500 in their budget for adult and children's programming. The funds were raised from the proceeds of the ongoing booksale and a "Christmas Quilt Drawing." Library Quilters," donated the beautiful handmade quilts used in the drawing.

Library circulation has continued to climb over the years. This, in part, is due to the many ways the Friends have helped the library increase public awareness to the types of services and programs the library is able to offer library users.
