Surviving the "Sinking of the Bismarck"

A Presentation by Bismarck Survivor Bruno Rzonca at the library on Wednesday, May 30, at 7 PM.



As a young man Bruno Rzonca was assigned to the shipyard where the great battleship, the Bismarck, was being constructed. The ship was to become the most important and famous German ship of all time.

The Bismarck was launched on February 14, 1939. The mission of the Bismarck was to interupt shipping between Halifax and the British Isles.

Rzonca and his shipmates were on board when the Bismarck sank the British Battleship HMS Hood.

Following the attack on the Hood British Prime Minister Winston Churchill gave the orders to "Sink the Bismarck."

After being spotted by a old Swordfish biplane, ships from the British Navy soon caught up with the Bismarck, pounding her with 700 rounds of ammunition.

Rzonca was one of 115 men out of a crew of 2,746 who survived the sinking of the Bismarck. Don't miss his harrowing tale May 30.

battle that led to its sinking.


Book Discussion
