

28th Annual Student Art Exhibit

A gallery of masterpieces created by Tri-Creek area students will grace the Children's Room for the Friends of the Library's 28th Annual Student Art Exhibit May 15-19.

Students, grades K-5, from Lake Prairie, Oak Hill, Three Creeks and St. Edward's Elementary will submit over 400 works of art for

the exhibit. "Art created from a child's perspective is fascinating to view, giving us a peek into their imaginations," said Library Director Barbara Berkey. "By hosting this exhibit each year at the library the Friends help nurture and encourage creativity and self-expression by providing an outlet for students to display their work."

During the week of the exhibit the Friends will hold a reception for the students and their family members. Students will be recognized for their efforts with a certificate of achievement. At the program on Wednesday, May 17, at 7 PM, Friends members will serve cake, punch and coffee.

On the Trail of Regional History

Time travel through history as author Kenneth J. Schoon presents stories from his remarkable book *Calumet Beginnings: Ancient Shorelines and Settlements at the South End of Lake Michigan.* Sponsored by the library and the Three Creeks Historical Association, the program will be held on Wednesday, May 24, at 7 PM. Refreshments will be served.

At his program Schoon will explain the geology of the area that was shaped by the effects left by the glaciers of the Ice Age and how nature continues to shape the landscape of the Calumet region.

From there he will take the listener on a journey of the region before 1833, when the land teamed with plants and animals. At that time the waters were clean and clear; bears, wolves and panthers, elk and bison, roamed the land; and the bald eagle commanded the skies. This was a period of tomahawks and arrowheads that would be buried for decades, later to be unearthed as testament that the Pottawatomie, Sauk and other Indian tribes were part of the region's legends.

Schoon's stories are filled with details of the French exploration and the fur trade, the last trading posts, the pioneers, the stagecoach run between Valparaiso and LaPorte, and Fort Dearborn.

Railroad buffs will enjoy Schoon's description and photographs of the beginning of the railroads in the Calumet region. The start of the steel industry is another fascinating part of the region's history. Along the way you will hear of the founding of cities and towns from Gary to Lowell. Burns Harbor, the Dunes, wetlands and sanctuaries are included in some of the 161 historic photographs in Schoon's book, some of which have never been published. The Illinois portion of the Calumet region is also well represented in Schoon's book.

Schoon is a professor of science education at Indiana University Northwest. In his book Schoon, who has a bachelor degree in geology, combines his love of science with his passion for history. Join us for a look back at *Calumet Beginnings*. Pre-register at 696-7704.

Each Saturday at 12 Noon kids of all ages are invited to enjoy a fun flick with friends.


