It's nail-biting time for Indiana libraries opposed to the proposed consolidation of Indiana libraries into county-wide systems or of being mandated to form county library planning committees. Passed by the Indiana Senate, the library reconstruction bill was then tacked on with four other reform proposals in the House that failed to exit out of committee.

But there have been concerns in the library community that the library reconstruction proposal might be inserted into another bill in a last minute ditch effort by legislators to see it passed. As of this printing the legislative has called a special session. We are awaiting the results and remain hopeful that your home library will remain independent.
