## Children's Programs at Lowell



**Story Time** is a 6 week program for 4 and 5 year olds. The program is offered at 10:00 AM on Tuesdays (through May 3<sup>rd</sup>) and Wednesdays (through May 4<sup>th</sup>). Parents must stay in the library during the program, however, not in the program room. Each session is limited to 15 children and lasts approximately 45 minutes. There is no charge for Story Time. You must pre-register at the circulation desk either by stopping by or calling the library at 696-7704.



**Toddler Time** is a FREE four week program for 2 and 3 year olds and is offered at 10 AM on Tuesdays (May 10 through May 31) and Wednesdays (May 11 through June 1). Each session lasts approximately 40 minutes. Parents must stay with the child during the program. Sessions are limited to 15 children, pre-registration is required. You may pre-register at the circulation desk or by calling the library at 696-7704.

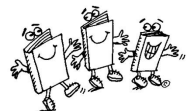

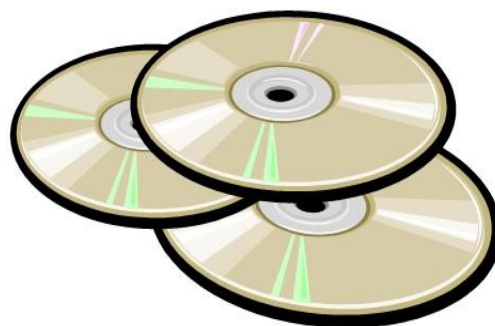

Freegal® Music is a free music service from your library. Freegal offers download or streaming access to more than 8 million songs, including Sony Music's catalog of legendary artists. In total the collection is comprised of music from over 28,000 labels with music that originates in over 80 countries. There is no software to download, and there are no digital rights management (DRM) restrictions.

To access *Freegal*, pick up an application form at the library and turn it in at the circulation desk or download one from the library's website. Look for the *Music* link on the left side of the page. An email message will be sent your address within 24 hours of being registered. You can download up to five songs per week!
