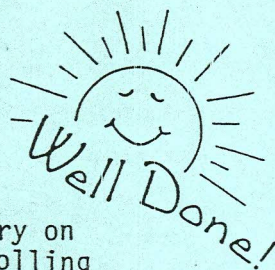


MORTGAGE-BURNING AND OPEN HOUSE A GREAT SUCCESS!!!!!!!

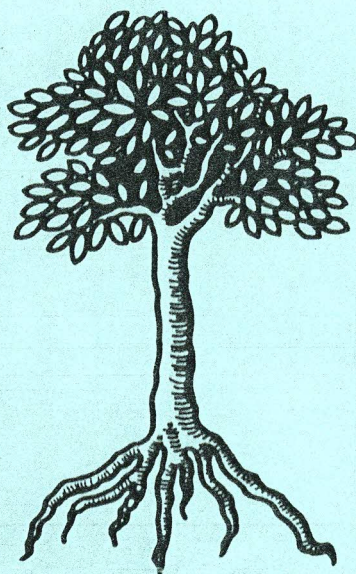
