

TWELVETH ANNUAL STUDENT ART EXHIBIT "A CELEBRATION IN COLOR"

It's May and nature is spreading its spring colors for all to see. The Lowell Public Library will also be alive with wonderful colors when the Friends of the Library present their twelveth "Annual Student Art Exhibit."

Held the week of May 18, the exhibit will showcase the works of talented Tri-Creek area students in grade K through 5.

One never knows what to expect from the creative young minds of the student artist. Last year's entries covered a multitude of art forms. Pastels, oils, ink drawings, paper mache, weaving, stencil and a variety of other medium hung from the library ceiling or rested on tables and shelves. Many of the pieces showed concern for the environment while others were whimsical or of images close to home.

The annual event is very popular with library patrons and is a wonderful way to encourage youngsters to continue to express themselves through art.

An awards presentation and reception in honor of the young students' achievements will be held. Thursday, May 21 at 7:00 PM. There will be a first, second, and third prize awarded at each grade level as well as a Best of Show.

Families of the students are invited to attend the reception. Friends of the Library will serve refreshments and a drawing for door prizes will be held for the art students and other children who attend the reception.

Tri-Creek area youngsters from Shelby and Schneider, are also invited to display their artwork at the branch libraries the week of June 1.

The Friends of the Library look forward to honoring these young students and invite the community to visit the library during this exhibit to view the wonderful examples of the children's creativity that will be displayed.



MUSIC FOR EVERYONE

Ballads, Blues, Rock and Roll----Opera, Chamber Music, Country and Western and the Big Beat---music to please just about anyone's ear is available on compact disc at the Lowell Public Library.

Adding to the library's own collection of over two hundred and fifty compact disc are several recent arrivals, currently on loan from the Indiana Audio/Video Network. Among the discs on loan are: Dark Side of the Moon by Pink Floyd, Back on Track a Billy Crash Craddock selection, music from the Fantasticks, with the original cast, and the music of Andrew Lloyd Webber. Other arrivals include Satch Plays Fats James Taylor's Sweet Baby James and Kiri Te Kanawa: Verdi and Puccini, Arias.

The discs will be on loan, from the service, for a two month period before being sent to another library. Lowell will then receive a new assortment. Patrons can make their selections from a special catalog located at the circulation desk, and the discs can be checked out for a two week period.

The library continues to update its own collection with new purchases. Among the selections on order are: Everyone's Wild About Harry, with artist Harry Connick, Jr., Crystal Gayle's These Days, Best Of by Lee Greenwood, Lou Reed's Magic and Loss, Dolly Parton's Greatest Hits, Eric Clapton's 24 Nights and Yo-Yo Ma & Bobby McFerrin

These compact discs and other new selections are expected to be available for checkout at the end of May .


