Watercolors, sculpture, paper mache, weaving, chalk drawings, pen and ink designs, murals, and other examples of different art forms will be on display by the talented young creators of the this year's art exhibit.

A reception to honor the young artists will be held on Wednesday, May 22, at 7 PM and families of the students are invited to attend. At the reception each artist will receive individual recognition for their work. Refreshments will be served in the Library Program Room and a drawing for art materials will be held for all children attending the reception. From June 2, to June 7, students who live in Shelby and Schneider can also display their art work at the branch libraries.

The exhibit and reception is sponsored by the Friends of the Library to encourage young people's interest in the arts and to provide art students with a vehicle to display their work.
