The Children's Room of the library will soon set the scene for a vast, colorful array of creative conceptions to treat the eye, courtesy of the imagination of Tri-Creek area students, grades K-5.

The 19th Annual Student Art Exhibit, sponsored by the Friends of the Library, will feature works of art from students of Lake Prairie, Oak Hill, Three Creeks and St. Edward's elementary schools. Each year, the ceiling, walls, and flat surfaces of the cabinets and bookshelves have been covered with artpieces created in oils, pastels, pen and ink drawing, stencil, weaving, papier-mache, and other art media.

To honor the achievements of the young artists and to give their families a special opportunity to view the artwork on exhibit, the Friends will host a reception on Thursday, May 20, at 7 PM. At the reception each artist will receive individual recognition for his work. The reception will be a festive affair with cake, punch and coffee served in the meeting room. To help foster the love of creating art, a drawing for art supplies will be held for all the children attending the reception.

The drawing for Beanie Baby "Gloria" will also be held the night of the reception. Raffle tickets are available at the circulation desk.
