The library opened its doors to a sell out crowd on Sunday, May 5. The event was the "Books in Bloom" high tea given by the Lowell Woman's Club to benefit the library.

Transforming the library's main aisle into a elegant area for fine dining, Woman's Club members served meals fit for royalty to over 180 people who had reserved their seats for an afternoon of lively entertainment and delicious cuisine. At their installation dinner on May 23, the Woman's Club presented Library Director Francine Shreffler with a check for \$3,500 from the fundraiser that will be used for the purchase of non-fiction books for the children's department.

"It was truly an amazing afternoon," Shreffler said of the tea. "Library patrons gave the tea rave reviews asking for a repeat next year. The Woman's Club outdid themselves in creating this wonderful event. We are truly grateful to the Woman's Club for their successful efforts on behalf of the library and the children of the community."

We've just completed planting the last of the new trees to enhance the library's nature trail and grounds and now we are looking "upwards" to a new but needed project.

The Library Board of Trustees recently determined that structural changes to the library's entrance overhang and a new ice/water shield for the roof were necessary to protect the building. The project, which includes replacing existing shingles, will take approximately two weeks to complete with starting date to be announced. The library applied for and received an additional appropriation from the state in the amount of \$100,000 toward the cost of the project.


During the renovation, the library will remain open and, when necessary, an alternative entrance will be used. We appreciate your patience during this time.
