**Library Director** 

Responsible for the daily operations of the library and its branches.

Head Reference Librarian

Head of the Reference Department. (with MLS). Also orders for the library's non-fiction and DVD collections. Offers outreach programs at nursing homes and participates in community events. Is the Friends of the Library liason and helps carry out fundraising initiatives. Bethany loves variety—it's the spice of life!

Children's Programming

Plans all programs and events for the children's department. Partners with the Lowell Parks Department to hold programs for our Senior Citizens. Orders for children's book collection! Jackie misses seeing all of the kids and families and can't WAIT until we can reopen fully and see them all again!

Cathy O. - 4 1/2 years

**Circulation Clerk** 

Circulation duties. Manages the libraries' Adult Book Club, covers & processes New Books, feeds the fish on Fridays!

Marjie G. - 5 3/4 years

**Circulation Clerk** 

Tries to keep materials properly shelved, maintains list of new DVDs for patrons, Circulation desk duties.

Tom T. - 6 years

**Custodial Supervisor** 

Maintains and repairs buildings and grounds here and at the branches. Builds projects for summer reading. Sets up rooms for library programs. Considers himself as a "Jack of all trades....but Master of none."

Sharon W. - 3 years

Copy Cataloger

Catalogs fiction books and DVDs. Changes book labels and system records, processes new and donated items. Sharon's favorite author is James Patterson.
