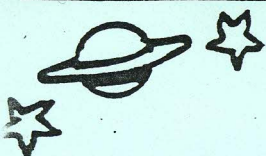

## "SUMMER READING CLUB REACHES OUTER LIMITS"

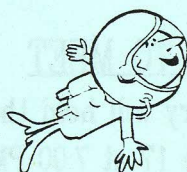
Step aboard the space flight to adventure as the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider Branches blast off to Summer Reading Club fun.

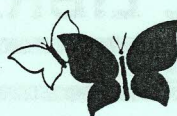
There are books about the environment, wild and domestic animals, cooking, hair styling, and lots more. Prices are low and the value is high.

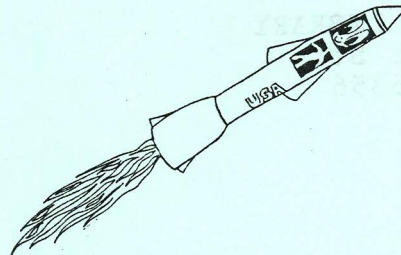

## GROUNDBREAKING SIGNALS CONSTRUCTION OF NEW LIBRARY

The days turned into months and the months turned into years for the Lowell Public Library Board of Trustees as they planned for the future library needs of the community they serve. Now they will watch as their careful planning becomes a reality with the building of a new library for the Tri-Creek area.

On June 5, a groundbreaking ceremony will mark the beginning of construction of the new 22,000 square foot building. Semford Contracting Co., Inc., which was awarded the contract to build the new facility, presented the library with a bid 3% lower than the architect's estimate for the cost of construction.

Sale of bonds for the project took place on May 19. INB National Bank, Indianapolis, won with the lowest bid of 6.69% a very favorable interest rate according to H.J. Umbaugh and Associates, the library's financial advisor. Bond closing is set for June 2. The cost to the local taxpayer was held to a minimum by grants from the State Library and Build Indiana Funds.

Flowers will bloom at the new library site thanks to the work of former board member Mary K. Bruce, her daughter Ann Miller, library staffer Maria Svorenick and Carol Pawlesak, a local resident.

Among the many flowers that were transplanted to the east side of the property to naturalize the woods were lilies of the valley, peonies, daffodils, jonquils and narcissus. Forsythia bushes were also transplanted to be used for landscaping. They will compliment the many red bud, hickory and oak trees that will shade the new library, expected to be completed in the spring of 1993.
