SOFTWARE FOR YOUR HARDWARE



Check out the variety of public domain and shareware software for free loan at the Lowell Public Library. In the librarys collection are spreadsheets, accounting programs, virus detectors, graphics, investment and retirement planning, bank programs which calculate loan and interest rates, plus fun and educational games.

AWARE, a software program provided free by the U.S. Department of Education, is the latest addition to the librarys collection. The program provides students with information about post-secondary educational opportunities, cost of attendance, and availability of financial aid.

Any person 14 years of age or older with a Lowell library card may borrow software for a two week period (limit of three software packages per patron). Although not available thru interlibrary loan or transit, software may be checked out by reciprocal borrowers if they pick it up and return it to the Lowell Library.

Overdue fines for software are \$.25 per item each day overdue.
Replacement charge for software that is lost, damaged or contains a virus is \$3.00 per disk. Software is checked for viruses upon return. The library is not responsible for data, program, or computer damages or loss when circulating software is used.

Software may not be returned in the bookdrop. A list of further guidelines for software is included with each circulating package.
