The Fishing is Great!

"Stocking the Pond" is a full time job for staff of the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider Branches. Catching the "big ones" at the libraries are members of the "Get Hooked On a Great Book" Summer Reading Club Program. Each time a reading club member reads ten books from easy readers or picture books he or she receives a fish to put on a line to hang in the library. The youngest club members, who are read to by a parent or grandparent, also earn fish for every ten books. Members who read J fiction or non-fiction books from the children's collection receive a fish for every chapter read.

The colorful fish hanging in the libraries reflect the growing number of books or chapters read by the over 400 members of this year's reading program. "Club members love to choose the books they want to read from the thousands of selections available in the children's collection. And, it is a special moment for young club members when they are old enough to print their names and receive their own library cards," stated Library Director Francine Shreffler.

Being a club member means you get to enjoy a variety of awesome programs that make summer vacation at the library a fun time. So far this summer club members have participated in a Kick-Off Cookout, pet shows, and craft programs. According to Children's Librarian Barbara Berkey, children can still sign up as Summer Readers and take part in upcoming programs such as the Bookwalk, Bingo, Movie Day, Game Day and the Grand Finale Carnival.

Kidz In Tune!

Early childhood music specialist Kathy Birk is the creator of Kidz in Tune. She will present three programs for 3-5 year olds at the Lowell Public Library on July 7, 14, and 21.

Each day's program will feature a different theme such as Rhythm and Rhyme, and will provide learning opportunities through the use of songs, movement activities, rhythm instruments and children's literature.

Although the July 7 program is almost full, pre-registrations are being accepted now for the July 14 program.

Pre-registrations for the July 21 program will be accepted starting July 12. Class sizes are limited and parents are encouraged to attend.

55 Alive Driver Refresher Course

AARP Driver's Safety Course will be held at the library on Tuesday, July 27 & Wednesday, July 28 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The course is the nation's first and largest classroom driver improvement program designed especially for motorists aged 55 and older. The course provides eight hours of classroom instruction that refine existing skills and develop safe, defensive driving techniques.

Class size is limited. Advance registration and prepayment fee of \$10 required upon registration.

Included in the course are a refresher of motor vehicle laws, driving techniques, and changes taking place on the road.

By successfully completing the course, participants may receive a discount on their auto insurance. Check with your insurance company company.

With a \$16,328 SBC
Excelerator Grant awarded to
the library in October of 2003,
a mobile computer lab was
established, allowing the library
the capability to instruct patrons
in beginning computer skills.

The mobile lab contains a combination printer/copier/ scanner to provide computer users the ability to become skilled in the use of this equipment and be able to access the results of their efforts. Six laptop computers and a PowerPoint projector were purchased for computer training.
